Take the ideas from this packet and feel free to make the ideas your own. ## What is Coins for Kids?

Join Girls Ministries clubs everywhere as we partner with Boys and Girls Missionary Challenge (BGMC\*) to make

our coins count. Coins for Kids (CFK) is the missions arm of Girls Ministries. Each year the national Girls Ministries Department, in cooperation with Assemblies of God World Missions and U.S. Missions, selects a missions project that specifically affects children.

Together we've helped build a school and church for families in Senegal, Africa, a multipurpose building for Camp AN in Alaska, and cooking centers for kids in South Africa. These are just a few of the ways we've been able to make a difference for kids. For more details about these projects and others, check out our past projects page at ngm.ag.org.

The Coins for Kids offering received during the project year and from the Nationwide Event not only benefits the national missions project but also contributes to BGMC when mailed to the national Girls Ministries Department.

\*Churches who give to Coins for Kids through the national Girls Ministries Department will get both BGMC and World Missions giving credit.

Girls will be more motivated to participate when they understand the difference they are making. Here are some ideas to get started:

 Each year a project that specifically affects children is selected and announced to

participating churches nationwide. This year's project is Wonderfully Made-Special Touch Ministry serving people with disabilities in the United States and beyond.

- Make girls aware of the project by distributing copies of the CFK Promo Card (1 per girl) and playing the CFK Promotional Video during a club meeting.
- Challenge the girls to set a goal for this year and then think creatively about how they might be able to meet it. Use the Faith Promise Cards.
- Purchase the silicone **CFK Bracelets** for your airls to wear as a reminder of their promise.
- Order the free Coins for Kids Promo Cards and Offering Boxes (see the Order Form). The card explains the ministry of Coins for Kids and this year's project.
- Customize the **Coins for Kids Offering Boxes** with project-themed labels. On our web site, you can find Offering Box Sticker Art (Avery label 5160) identifying the project. Print these labels and stick

them on the back of each offerina box.

Note: Create your own offering containers. You can also have the girls use potato chip cans to collect coins and cash. There is Can Label



art (Avery Full Sheet labels) that can be printed as labels or on plain paper and taped to the can

- Be sure that girls bring their offerings to each fund-raising event.
- Remember to keep raising funds throughout the year.

**Krystal** is nineteen years old, but many say that she looks about twelve. She has Down syndrome with intellectual disabilities. As a person with Down syndrome, Krystal struggles with everyday tasks that many of us take for granted, like putting toothpaste on her toothbrush, picking out appropriate clothes to wear, and choosing the right foods. She loves to be involved in sports, but her disability means that she is often the last one chosen to be on a team.

Krystal needs help to navigate life and can get frustrated when she's not able to do the things she wants to do. She wants to have fun and enjoy the same activities others enjoy, but this is not always possible. However, one thing Krystal is really good at is being a friend! If you become Krystal's friend, you have a friend for life.

- Fast Facts about Friends Like Krystal
  Down syndrome is the most commonly occurring chromosomal condition. Approximately one in every seven hundred babies in the United States is born with Down syndrome.
- Down syndrome occurs in people of all races and economic levels.
- People with Down syndrome have an increased risk for certain medical conditions such as congenital heart defects, respiratory and hearing problems, Alzheimer's disease, childhood leukemia, and thyroid conditions. Many of these conditions are now treatable, so most people with Down syndrome lead healthy lives.
- A few of the common physical traits of Down syndrome are low muscle tone, small stature, an upward slant to the eyes, and a single deep crease across the center of the palm. Every person with Down syndrome is a unique individual and may possess these characteristics to different degrees or not at all.
- All people with Down syndrome experience cognitive delays, but the effect is usually mild to moderate and is not indicative of the many strengths and talents that each individual possesses.

## **Experience Krystal's World**

## Materials needed

Several pairs of clean socks

Two toothbrushes

Two tubes of toothpaste, still in the box

Meet Krystal C

A high school level book and a simple children's book

Two pairs of shoes with laces

## **Getting Ready**

1. Set up the game for a relay. Station 1 should be a table with the boxes of toothpaste and toothbrushes.

- 2. Station 2 should be a leader with both books.
- 3. Station 3 should be the two pairs of shoes.

## Directions

- Ask six girls to participate in the relay. If you would like to repeat the game so that everyone has a chance to play, you will need more unopened boxes of toothpaste.
- 2. Divide the six girls into teams of three. Team A will compete without socks, but ask Team B to place socks over their hands.

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- 3. The first two girls should stand next to the table at Station 1, the second pair should stand next to the leader in Station 2, and the third pair should stand by the shoes.
- 4. When the leader says "Go," the first two girls (one with socks on her hands, one without) should open the box of toothpaste, open the toothpaste tube, and put toothpaste on the toothbrush. Each girl will run to tag her teammate at Station 2.
- 5. When the girls at Station 2 are tagged, they should read one page of a book out loud as quickly as possible. Team A should read from the children's book, Team B should read from the high school-level book. When the leader at Station 2 has heard one page, she allows the girl to run and tag her teammate at Station 3.
- 6. When the players at Station 3 are tagged, they should tie the shoes as quickly as possible. (The player from Team B will have socks on her hands.)

- 7. The first team to tie both of the shoes wins the game.
- After the game is played, ask "How fair was this game? Was it harder for the players from Team B? Why?"
- Tell the girls that for many friends like Krystal, everyday tasks are harder than they are for most people. Tell them that wearing socks on their hands helped them feel the frustration that people with Down syndrome or other disabilities might feel.
- Inform the girls that many people with intellectual disabilities find reading and learning harder. When asked to read or complete work that others find simple, they might feel like they are asked to do something much harder (like reading the high schoollevel book.)
- Ask the girls how the activity could help us know how to treat friends like Krystal.





**Savanna** is nine years old. She has spina bifida and uses a wheelchair for mobility. She is a very smart girl and wants to do all the physical things her friends can do. She has to face that she will never be able to do them in the same way as others, unless God heals her. Stairs, heavy doors, and spaces too tight for wheelchairs make daily tasks hard. Yes, she will dance, but in her wheelchair. She will play baseball, but will need to push her wheelchair to the base.

Life isn't always easy for Savanna. It can be hard to make friends who are accepting of her differences. However, Savanna doesn't take the easy way out. Even when everyday tasks are difficult, she doesn't give up!

### Fast Facts about Friends Like Savanna

- Spina bifida is the most common permanently disabling birth defect in the United States.
- Spina bifida literally means "split spine."
- Spina bifida happens when a baby is in the womb and the spinal column does not close all of the way.
- Every day, about eight babies are born in the United States with spina bifida or a similar birth defect of the brain and spine.
- People with spina bifida need assistance to learn how to get around on their own without help, by

## **Experience Savanna's World**

## **Materials Needed**

A wheelchair or office chair with wheels

Two basketballs

Masking or painter's tape

A basketball goal, trash can, hula hoop or other goal to throw balls into

Space to play

## **Getting Ready**

- 1. Create a line using tape to mark where the girls will shoot a basket.
- 2. If using a hula hoop, trash can, or other makeshift goal, try to place it high enough that shooting from a seated position will be more challenging.
- 3. Divide the girls into two teams facing the goal, with distance to run to the line before shooting.

## Directions

 Tell the girls that they will race to make a basket in the goal. Each girl should dribble the ball to the line and shoot. She should then come back and pass the ball to the next player on the team.

- 2. Tell the girls that there is a catch. Team B's players must do so without getting out of the rolling chair. Another teammate can help them push the chair, but the girl in the chair must try to dribble the ball all the way to the line and must shoot the ball herself.
- 3. If a player drops the ball, a chair pusher may help her retrieve the ball, but the player may not get up out of the chair.
- 4. One point is given for each basket that is made.
- 5. Allow girls to play.
- After the game is over, talk about the frustrations of having to play the game in a chair. Discuss how friends who use wheelchairs might feel when trying to do the normal things other kids do.
- Ask the girls to brainstorm ways to include friends like Savanna in their lives.



**Hayle** is all grown up now, but life as child was extremely difficult. She was born deaf, but that wasn't discovered until she was almost a year old. When her hearing loss was found, she was put into speech therapy, and at age five, had surgery to receive a cochlear implant. A cochlear implant is a device to help people with severe hearing problems receive and process some sounds. The implant didn't give Hayle the confidence and help that her parents had hoped it would. She was also asked to learn to speak instead of using sign language, which she found very difficult. Through years of speech therapy, Hayle was constantly frustrated. She felt that she was expected to become "hearing" and what others might consider "normal", but Hayle felt different and alone.

Hayle attended church as a child, but she was never able to understand what was going on. She couldn't hear the music, announcements, or even the pastor's sermons, and never understood that Jesus loves her and had died for her. When Hayle grew up, though, something amazing happened. She attended a church that had a sign language interpreter. She was able to receive the good news about Jesus for the first time! Her life changed that day.

Through her church, Hayle was able to get involved in ministry and attend deaf retreats with other deaf Christians. Being involved with other deaf people opened a whole new world to her and made her feel normal for the first time in her life. She's grateful that God has helped her find friends that she can communicate with and they understand and accept her.

## Fast Facts about Friends Like Hayle

- There are an average of two to three deaf/hard of hearing persons in every one thousand in every country of the world.
- Less than 4 percent of deaf people have accepted Jesus Christ as personal Savior.
- Only 8 percent of deaf people have ever attended a church.
- The Deaf have their own cultural identity and language, and are considered an unreached people group. Almost 98 percent have never understood the good news that Jesus came to save them from their sins.
- Research indicates that the more American Sign Language vocabulary a child knows, the more English vocabulary that child is likely to know. (Hermans et al. 2008); (Holzinger & Fellinger 2014).

## **Experience Hayle's World**

## Materials needed

Paper Pen or Pencil Scissors

## **Getting Ready**

- Write the following phrases on a piece of paper: Wash the dishes with hot water. Turn in your homework. Grab your backpack. Brush your teeth. Close the door. Make your bed. Write the alphabet. Use your fork.
- 2. Cut the directions into individual slips and fold them in half.
- 3. If your group is large, you might want to add more directions to the list so more girls participate.

## Directions

- Explain to the girls that they will be asked to communicate to the other girls without using words. They may not use American Sign Language for this activity, but can gesture and point. They may not talk or use sounds.
- 2. Choose a girl to go first and have her draw a slip of paper. She should read it but not show it to the group.

- 3. Allow the girl to act out the action on the piece of paper.
- 4. The other girls should try to guess the directions being given.
- 5. The first girl to guess gets the next turn.
- 6. Continue playing until all the slips have been taken.
- Say, "Was it harder for you to understand what your friends were trying to tell you when they couldn't use words? Kids like Hayle can be frustrated because they can't understand what's being asked of them. It can be frustrating when the people around them can't speak their language. If we all knew and used sign language to communicate the same words, this activity would have been much simpler. But for many deaf children, their family and friends are challenged to communicate with them."
- Ask the girls to discuss the importance of ministry to friends like Hayle.





## National Girls Ministries Event

## What is the Nationwide Event?

The Nationwide Girls Ministries Event is designed to help make a global impact. Many groups use this event to challenge girls to raise money to collectively support the annual CFK project. It's amazing to see what happens when thousands of girls all work together to make a difference. This event occurs annually on the fourth Friday and Saturday of September, but it can be held on another night if that works better for your church. For elementary-age girls, it's a great way to begin the clubs' year and invite guests to church.

The Event Planning Guide provides a session specifically designed to inspire giving to the Coins for Kids project. To plan for the event, use the Event Planning Guide provided on the NGM Web site. It includes a planning timeline, suggestions for activities, décor, and snacks, as well as a spiritual challenge. The event is designed for any church to use as a girls-only event. It is a great tool for outreach to the community and includes a salvation message. Not only is the event fun for girls, it's also a valuable tool to help raise money for the Coins for Kids project.

**DURING THE EVENT**, National Girls Ministries will be LIVE on social media on Friday, September 28, 2018. Check out the Event Planning Guide for more details. Don't miss the opportunity to win fun giveaways and prizes!

**REMIND** girls to bring their Coins for Kids offerings. Take time to review what they've learned about Special Touch Ministry project using the *Promotional Video* and other resources as needed.

We have a weekend scheduled each year for our annual event (fourth Friday of September), but the event can be done at your convenience. We will supply a fun, planning packet and other resources to help make your event special anytime!

**PRAY** for God to bless these gifts and the givers. Ask Him to use the offering to grow His kingdom and bring children and adults who are differently

## **Fund-Raisers**

## Name Your 10

**ASK** each girl to think of ten family members and/ or friends and make a list.

**DISTRIBUTE** Coins for Kids Offering Boxes —10 per girl. Say to the girls: "Hey girls, do you know ten people? Give one of these boxes to each of your ten friends or family members. Ask them to put the box somewhere that people can see it and give.

When it's full, they return it to you so you can give the money to Coins for Kids." Ask the girls to set a goal for giving and help select an end date for this fundraiser.

**OFFER** a prize (such as a large candy bar or a small toy) to each girl who successfully completes the challenge.



## Adopt-a-Need

**DISCUSS** the breakdown of project with costs, and set a special goal for your church's group using the Goal Sheet printable resource.

**EXPLAIN** that through this project, many kids and adults who are differently abled will get what they need and learn about how much Jesus loves them. Special Touch Ministry even teaches churches how to care for people who are differently abled.

The total project cost is more than \$180,000. Here are some needs you can discuss with the girls to spark giving goals and help them see how giving can change lives:

- Bed Sheets \$25 per set
- Bed Rails \$60 each
- Rollator Walker \$80 each
- Portable Wheelchair Ramps \$100 each
- Storage Shelf \$100 each
- First Aid Supply Bins \$150 each
- Folding Shower Chair \$200 each
- Walker \$200 each
- Diabetes Testing Meters & Supplies \$250
- Reclining Shower Chair \$400 each
- Care Supply Bins \$500 each

## **Family Fun Night**

**PICK** a family-friendly event or movie\*, and invite the families from the church to come and bring their friends. Charge an admission price per person; include concessions in the cost. \*NOTE: Your church must have a CVLI to play a video in a public setting.



#### CONCESSION IDEA: POPCORN BUFFET

Ahead of time, ask people to donate popcorn and the add-in items. Have plenty of fresh popcorn ready when guests arrive, along with a lineup of fun add-in ingredients:

- Colored chocolate candies
- Gummy bears
- Pretzels
- Miniature marshmallows
- Other sweet and savory options

**REMEMBER** to set aside time to talk about the project and pass around a donation container.

## 7-7-7 Fund-Raiser

**ASK** groups of seven girls to get seven people to give them seven dollars each.

**DISTRIBUTE** flyers with the following text: "Hey girls, do you know seven people? Then you can take on the 7-7-7 challenge! Just get seven people to give seven dollars each to Coins for Kids. That's all there is to it! Boost your chances by offering to do odd jobs, like cleaning the dishes or other household chores."

**OFFER** a prize (such as a large candy bar or a small toy) to each girl who successfully completes the challenge.

## **Pancake Breakfast**

**HOST** a pancake breakfast for your church congregation and community. Businesses may be willing to donate some of the needed supplies. For instance, some restaurants will donate batter. Grocery stores may also donate food and supplies, such as paper products. (Most businesses need at least a month's notice and official requests from the church.) Promote business sponsors with flyers or table signs.

**RECRUIT** volunteers. Get girls, leaders, and parents involved. You'll need people to help with the following:

- Promoting the event and selling tickets
- Securing donations
- Setting up tables and chairs, planning décor, etc.
- Cooking and food preparation
- Serving
- Cleaning up

**COMPILE** a list of needed supplies. Parents may also be willing to donate some of these. Every little bit helps. Items to consider include:

- Pancake toppings (syrup, fruit, peanut butter, chocolate chips, jam, etc.)
- Beverages (milk, juice, coffee)
- Possible sides (bacon, sausage, eggs, etc.)
- Paper products (disposable plates, cups, utensils, and napkins)
- Decorations and signs

**DETERMINE** the cost of hosting the event. This will depend on how many items are donated and how many meals you will prepare. Be sure you raise enough funds to exceed your cost investment. Selling tickets in advance will help ensure a profit and provide an idea of how much food you'll need. A suggested price is \$3 for kids and \$5 for adults. You could offer a family package for \$30.

#### ADDITIONAL IDEAS:

- Create placemats with information about this year's Coins for Kids project, and leave a **Coins** for Kids Promo Card (item #73MT4112) and **Coins for Kids Offering Box** (item #73MT4943) on each table for those who wish to make additional contributions. The girls can help craft the placemats. You can use the free downloadable Coins for Kids resources available at ngm.ag.org/Missions/Coins-for-Kids (Bank Labels, Table Tents, and Can Label).
- Have the girls wait tables for tips. (Don't allow young girls to handle hot drinks, however.)
- Have some of the girls put on a talent show or present information about Special Touch

Ministry while guests eat breakfast.

• Cover the tables with blank newsprint. Have the girls decorate the covers with their handprints and favorite Bible verses.

## Walk/Run Coins for Kids

**RECRUIT** volunteers such as parents and leaders to help.

**DECIDE** where you will walk or run. There are all kinds of places where you can stage your event: in a park, on a high school track, or even inside a mall. Pick a distance and a location. One-mile, two-mile, and five-mile walks are popular. Shorter distances are always less intimidating. Keep in mind that some locales require permits, and you'll want an area where you can have a celebration when walkers finish the course.

**PROMOTE** your event. Use your girls, parents, and leaders to spread the word.

Create a form for each participant to track donations. Donations could be made per lap, per mile, or for the entire walk or run.

## ADDITIONAL IDEAS:

- Provide a snack and water for participants.
- Have a collection spot for donations.
- Celebrate by giving a small token gift to the finishers. These gifts could be donated by a local business or donor.
