WINNIE: (She enters carrying a garbage can and singing her song to the tune of "Here We Go 'Round

the Mulberry Bush.") Here we go 'round this great big world, this great big

world. Here we go 'round this great big world, telling people 'bout Jesus. Hi, everyone.

INTERVIEWER: Hi, Winnie. It's great to see you. What's that in your hand?

WINNIE: A garbage can.

INTERVIEWER: A garbage can? I can't even guess what a garbage can has to do with our lesson today. Tell us

what country we're studying, and what it has to do with a garbage can.

WINNIE: The country I'm going to tell you about is Romania. Romania is located in Eastern Europe. In

Jesus' time, this land became part of the Roman Empire. It was then called Romania, which

means "Land of the Romans," and the people were called Romanians.

INTERVIEWER: That's very interesting, Winnie. I did not know that. But what does this garbage can have to do

with the country of Romania?

WINNIE: Romania had been under Communist control for a long time. While under Communist control,

the people were kept very poor. Many families couldn't afford to feed their children. In other

cases, many fathers and mothers died, leaving their children alone.

INTERVIEWER: What happened to all these children?

WINNIE: There was no one to care for them. These children found homes in the sewers of the big cities

and learned to find food by eating out of garbage cans.

INTERVIEWER: You mean you brought this garbage can to remind all of us that in some countries of the world,

people don't have homes to live in, or moms to take care of them, or food to eat?

WINNIE: That's right. Many, many orphaned children are living on the streets of Romania. The only home

they have is holes in the ground where the sewer pipes go through. They have to hunt and beg

for food or eat out of garbage cans.

INTERVIEWER: Do we have missionaries there? Is anyone doing anything to help reach the kids of Romania?

WINNIE: Yes. We have missionaries there that are doing their best to help feed these children. Some of

the missionaries are building orphanages where children can have a home to live in and food to

eat.

INTERVIEWER: I'm so glad that we have missionaries who care about the children and are doing whatever they

can to help these children. What else can you tell us about what our missionaries are doing in

Romania?

WINNIE: Since the people of Romania are so poor, Missionary Sheila Hall started Compassion Outreach

Ministry. This ministry is helping to give refugees and Gypsies food and clothing donated by businesses and churches in America. While they feed and clothe people, they also tell them

about Jesus!

INTERVIEWER: That's great, Winnie. They are meeting both their spiritual and their physical needs!

WINNIE: Oh, yes, and that's not all. Our missionaries have helped bring in HealthCare Ministries teams

from America to treat medical needs and distribute eyeglasses to people who cannot afford to

buy their own eyeglasses.

INTERVIEWER: What else are they doing to reach the children of Romania?

WINNIE: They're having kids' crusades, summer camps, and Christian schools. The missionaries are also

reaching the Gypsy children, giving them new shoes, providing schooling, and telling them

about Jesus.

INTERVIEWER: Sometimes we forget just how blessed we are here in America. We have homes to live in, shoes

to wear, and food to eat. We need to share some of our blessings with the people of the world.

WINNIE: You can do that by giving to BGMC. BGMC is helping to reach children around the world.

BGMC also helps to provide schooling for street kids, clothes for them, and also food. Our

missionaries love BGMC!

INTERVIEWER: Thank you for coming today, Winnie, and reminding us about the needs around the world and
