WINNIE: (She enters carrying a packet of seeds while singing her song to the tune of "Here We Go

> 'Round the Mulberry Bush.") Here we go 'round this great big world, this great big world, this great big world. Here we go 'round this great big world, telling people 'bout Jesus. Hi, everyone.

INTERVIEWER: Hi, Winnie, it's good to see you again. Are you getting ready to plant a garden?

No, but these seeds are going to help me talk about missions. WINNIE:

INTERVIEWER: What do seeds have to do with missions? Our missionaries are not farmers.

True, but they are "seed planters." The seeds they plant are not to grow plants, but to grow the WINNIE:

gospel.

Winnie, I think you'll need to explain this more. I don't guite understand. **INTERVIEWER:**

WINNIE: Let's talk about the country of India. India is a large country, with over one billion people living

there. China is the only country with more people than India. India also has more than sixteen

hundred languages that the people speak.

That's a lot of people and a lot of different languages. Tell us more. INTERVIEWER:

WINNIE: India's main religion is Hindu. Hindus worship millions of gods. They believe that cows are holy,

so they will not kill them. They also believe that when a person dies, that person will come back

again into a different life. Most of the people in India are very poor.

INTERVIEWER: The Bible says that we all die once and then face God's judgment. These people need to hear

the truth about God's Word and how there is only one God and that He loves them.

WINNIE: That's right. Many, many years ago, missionaries came to India, but it wasn't easy for them. The

missionaries caught diseases and were threatened by people who didn't want to hear about

Jesus.

INTERVIEWER: Did those missionaries stay or did they go home? **WINNIE:** They stayed, and slowly the people started to listen. But for more than sixty years, not many

seeds had taken root.

INTERVIEWER: Farmers know that unless a seed starts to sprout roots and grow deep into the soil, it will not

grow—the tiny plant will die.

WINNIE: There is good news! Over the past several years, the gospel seeds that the early missionaries

planted have finally sprouted.

INTERVIEWER: What has happened, Winnie?

WINNIE: People are starting to respond to the gospel message. We also have Christian schools, hospitals,

youth camps, feeding programs, and orphanages.

INTERVIEWER: That's so exciting, Winnie. Those early missionaries long ago worked really hard to plant the

gospel seeds, and now a harvest of souls is taking place in India.

WINNIE: With over one billion people, there is still a lot of work to do. There are still thousands of villages

and cities that are waiting for someone to come and plant the gospel seeds. We really need to

pray for India.

INTERVIEWER: God can use the kids here in America as seed planters every time they pray for India and give
