**WINNIE:** (She enters carrying an American flag\* and a Liberian flag\* while singing her song to the tune

of "Here We Go 'Round the Mulberry Bush.") Here we go 'round this great big world, this great big world, this great big world, there we go 'round this great big world, telling people 'bout

Jesus. Hi, everyone.

**INTERVIEWER:** Hi, Winnie. Are you going to talk about America today?

**WINNIE:** No, but I'm going to talk about a country that America helped to start.

**INTERVIEWER:** This sounds interesting. What country is it, Winnie?

**WINNIE:** The country is Liberia. Liberia is located on the coast of West Africa. It's about the size of

Pennsylvania.

**INTERVIEWER:** How did America help to start this country?

**INTERVIEWER:** The people need to know that only Jesus can set them free from all their sin. Do we have

missionaries in Liberia?

**WINNIE:** Missionaries have now returned. Churches are being rebuilt. And with the help of BGMC, the

Bible schools are now open and fixed up. BGMC paid for the Bible schools to get new buildings,

new tables, new chairs, new library books, and new water wells.
